

SIDEWALK PROGRAM FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Houston Public Works **Sidewalk Program** constructs new sidewalks and ramps along streets leading to schools, major thoroughfares and improves accessibility for people with disabilities*.

* The Pedestrian Accessibility Review process is managed through the Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities

Why is the Sidewalk Program only for new sidewalks and not the repair of existing sidewalks? According to City of Houston <u>Code of Ordinances Article III</u>, <u>Sections 40-83 & 84</u> property owners of the adjoining sidewalk are responsible for the repair of existing sidewalks.

Who maintains sidewalks, curbs and ramps after they are built?

After constructed, property owners of the adjoining sidewalk are responsible for the repair and maintenance of sidewalks.

Does the Americans with Disabilities Act require the City to provide sidewalks?

No. However, when the City builds a sidewalk it must be accessible to persons with disabilities to the extent technically feasible.

What is the average length of time between a request and new sidewalk construction?

The length of time between a request and new sidewalk construction depends on the type of request, available program funding and number of requests received.

Up to how many feet of new sidewalk can be requested?

Up to four blocks can be requested for school and major thoroughfares. The Pedestrian Accessibility Review program provides up to 1,500 feet.

What can be done to prevent tree roots from damaging sidewalks?

Trees planted around sidewalks should be restricted to species with vertically growing roots, rather than horizontally. Root barriers should be installed while planting trees.
