

GENERAL PROJECT INFORMATION

Q: What is the purpose of this project?

A: This project will stabilize the southbound bridge to allow it to withstand another significant storm. The bridge supports were impacted by damage to the riverbed during Hurricane Harvey. Work will also be done at the northbound and southbound bridges to restore proper movement of the structure.

Q: What is going to be replaced/installed in this project?

A: The scope of this project provides the following: installation of supports at four locations at the north end of the southbound bridge, replacement of bridge components under both bridges, replacement of one deck joint at southbound bridge.

Q: Will this impact any of my services (water, sewer, etc.)?

A: The bridges support a gas line and telecommunication lines. These services will not be affected.

Q: Will the whole bridge be redone?

A: No, the work is limited to locations that need repair.

Q: What is being done to verify underground work is properly connected as there are concerns about drainage?

A: The City's inspection team ensures the project is built to the design standards and meets all City codes and requirements.

Q: How long is this project going to take to complete?

A: The project will be completed in 160 calendar days. Work is scheduled to begin in August 2020 and anticipated to be completed in January 2021. The project schedule depends upon weather conditions.

Q: What are the construction work days?

A: The contractor will work Monday-Friday from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM. The contractor will also work from Sunday at 5:00 PM thru Monday at 5:00 AM when work requires closure of one bridge.

Q: Why have various markers and protective barriers been placed on the bridge?

A: The contractor will close one lane on the southbound bridge between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM for delivery of construction materials. When work requires temporary closure of one bridge, the barriers and markers will divert traffic to allow two-way traffic on the other bridge.

Q: How long are the bridges and when were they built?

A: The bridges are 3,776 ft long. The northbound bridge was built in 1992 and southbound bridge was built in 1993.

CONSTRUCTION

Q: At some point, will the whole bridge be shut down?

A: One bridge will be closed between Sunday at 5:00 PM and Monday at 5:00 AM for up to 8 weekends. The open bridge will allow for traffic in both directions.

Q: Will updates be provided to area businesses?

A: Property manager or representatives are invited to attend the monthly contractor status meetings that will allow them to provide periodic updates to the community.
